Ken Deering called the September 13, 2022, Regular Board Meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u>: Doug Sonnemann made a motion to approve the Agenda for the September 13, 2022, Board Meeting. Dave Ellison seconded the motion. Motion was approved.

<u>Minutes of the August 9, 2022, Regular Board Meeting</u>: Dave Ellison made a motion to approve the August 9, 2022, Regular Board Meeting Minutes with changes from Barbara Henningsen, minutes not to be posted online until approved by Board. Doug Sonnemann seconded the motion. Motion was approved.

Agenda Item 1: Old Business

- A. Well 10 CMAR Project
 - Obtained full approval from NDEP. Turned NDEP approvals and easements into Douglas County on 9/1/22. Waiting for Douglas County to approve the building permit.
- B. 1394 Hwy 395 Parceling Project
 - RCI turned in revisions to Douglas County on 8/25/22. RCI turned in mylars Douglas County signatures and paid all fees on 9/7/22.
- C. <u>Highway 395 Waterline Improvement Project</u> GWC and RCI are reviewing tentative plans to submit to NDOT for final approval.
- D. 2022 Chevy Silverado Purchase

The new 2022 Chevy Silverado, approved February 2022, will be complete on 9/16/22 then shipped to Champion Chevrolet. After it arrives, they will contact GWC to proceed with the purchase.

Agenda Item 2A: Discussion only Regarding Rate Study

Staff recommends 8% rate increase for 2023 and 7% for 2024. This will allow improving the asset replacement schedule replacement costs, expenses forecast, inflation, reserves, and future population changes. A Rate Increase Newsletter will be mailed with September 1st water bill to inform the customers of the upcoming rate change. This item would be on the October 11, 2022, Board Meeting agendas to provide for any customer input. A final vote would be at the October 11, 2022, Board Meeting.

Recommendation

Manger and staff recommend the Board of Directors adopt an 8% rate increase for January 1, 2023 and 7% rate increase for January 1, 2024 for water user fees and private fire fees.

Calvin from Waterworth, via zoom, reviewed the Rate Study with the Board. Calvin explained that GWC as a company is doing very well and not in debt to anyone. Other water companies have not had increases for quite some time and will be in trouble when it comes to capital improvements. He explained that GWC is utilizing an Asset Management Plan to determine appropriate spending and reserve amounts.

Consensus of Board, agreed to proceed with the Rate Study as presented. They agreed to place this item on the October 11, 2022 Board Meeting agenda to allow for public comment and a final vote on October 11, 2022.
