# PREPARING FOR WINTER

Autumn is a beautiful time of year, and a good time to start thinking about winterizing your home.

Below are some tips on how you can prevent headaches and extra expenses that might occur when Winter comes:

- Turn off your irrigation
- Insulate water pipes
- Locate your home shut-off valve
- Check for leaks in pipes, hoses, hose connections, and faucets
- Remove all hoses from hose connections
- Close foundation vents
- Keep garage door closed
- When you're away, keep your thermostat at 55 degrees or higher



# SHUT OFF THAT WATER —

Do you know how to turn off the water to your home if there is an emergency?

Knowing how to shut off your water can prevent water damage to your property in the event of an earthquake, winter freeze or other emergency, it is also valuable when doing those home improvement projects.

The following steps will help you locate and turn off the "house valve." Your house valve will be outside the home and may be located in the front, side or back yard. Locate the two pipes coming up from the ground, one will be your house valve and the other will be your irrigation valve.

You will need a water key, if you don't have one they are available at your local hardware store. Turn the key clockwise to turn on the water, turn it counter clockwise to turn it back off.



# EFFICIENT TOILETS SAVE TRILLIONS OF GALLONS OF WATER

Replace toilets installed before 1994 with high-efficiency toilets. Replace older toilets that use 3.50gpf (gallons per flush) with high-efficiency toilets that uses 1.28 gpf saveing 2.22gpf. The EPA WaterSense program labels efficient toilets that use a maximum 1.28gpf. If the toilet is flushed six times each day it will save 13 gallons per day that's 4,745 gallons per year.

Check toilets to verify they are working properly. Make sure the water level is not too high, the fill valve is working properly, and the flapper is not leaking. A running toilet can waste hundreds of gallons of water per day. If you hear the water running in the toilet tank for an unusual length of time, a simple adjustment can return it to normal operation.



# **MANAGING WATER QUALITY FROM SOURCE TO TAP**
