Doug Sonnemann called the June 10, 2025, Regular Board Meeting to order at 4:01 p.m.

Public Present: David Bruketta.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u>: Ken Deering made a motion to approve the Agenda for the June 10, 2025, Board Meeting. Dave Ellison seconded the motion. Motion was approved.

Water Operations Supervisor Quarterly report:

Jon Summer notified the board that they have been busy with the supervision of the Maverick water lines being installed. The operators painted the foundation rings around the tanks with epoxy paint, handled weed control, and have been working with CAT for Well 7.

Public Comment: (No Action) – This portion of the meeting is open to the public to speak on any topic not on tonight's agenda, limited to three minutes.

Agenda Item 1: Old business

A. Well 7 Generator

CAT installed missing parts. The transfer switch was setup and tested 06/04/25. CAT will be returning to replace the temperature sending unit and gauge. The generator is working.

While the talking with the technician, Jon Summers discussed with him preventative maintenance that can be done by CAT every three years, including radiator flushing, replacing hoses, oil changes, and a

full diagnosis of any potential issues. Jon has contacted CAT to obtain a quote for a preventative maintenance plan.

CAT determined that the temperature gauge was faulty. They will schedule installation and perform a load bank test. Jon Summers and Ken Deering will be on-site to observe the testing.

B. Well 11 Water Right Protest

Nevada Division of Water Resources has indicated that the application to transfer water rights is ready to present the application to the State Engineer for final review. The original filing was July 2024 and protests were filed in August of 2024. GWC is still waiting for both participants to review and sign the agreements which has taken a lot longer than anticipated. GWC will continue to work with the two parties to obtain a signed agreement.

C. Town of Minden Well Location

No update has been received from the Town of Minden.

David Bruketta informed the board that Lyon County uses DOWL Engineering and they indicated that they have a half a million dollar contract to engineer the well.
